

# Rounders— review from Jess and Sophie



As our school's most popular sport, we have a staggering 34 students taking awards for football this evening. This highlights the real commitment shown from Alcester Academy to the sport of football and the ongoing development being made in competition year upon year.

We will now share a brief highlight from each of our competitive teams over the past year.

#### Year 7

The year 7 team faced a challenging start to the season, with a tough opening match against Campion School in the District Cup in early October. Despite the loss, the team showed resilience and determination, which became more evident as the season progressed.

As they gained more experience, the team's confidence grew and the highlight of the season came during a hard-fought (2-2) draw against St. Benedict's, where the team displayed strong teamwork, and signs of progression. This performance showcased the team's potential for the future.

In addition to their league matches, the team also participated in the South Warwickshire 7-a-side Tournament, where they put in encouraging displays.

Overall, the year 7 team's season was marked by improved performance that they can build upon for the challenges ahead in year 8.

#### Year 8

The year 8 team has had a promising season, with a notable performance against Studley, winning an exciting and entertaining game (5-4). They also secured a (2-0) victory against St Benedict's and earned a hard-fought (2-2) draw against AGS. #### Year 9

## Year 11

A memorable cup run started with an incredible (1-0) win against Stoke Park, before facing Sydney Stringer in a tense match where they emerged victorious, winning (8-7) on penalties, showcasing an outstanding team performance with all the team celebrating like they had won the cup.

This year, each year group has had its own team, leading to a significant increase in participation but also performance. The commitment and effort from all players have been reflected in their performances in the South Warwickshire Tournament, with the year 10 team winning and the other year





#### **Notice for Parents**

To comply with the School Attendance (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2024 and Data Protection expectations, it is vitally important that Alcester Academy keeps accurate and up to date information relating to every pupil on roll.

The information we are required to record includes:

- Pupil's full legal name (and if appropriate, their preferred name).
- The name, address and contact details of every person known to the school/academy who is a parent\* to the pupil with whom the pupil normally resides (this is the address that has been used to register with their GP).
- The name, address and contact details of any additional parent\*.
- Any other emergency contact details.

In order to gather this information, every year we send out data collection forms. Parents are asked to complete the form with as much information as possible and then return to the school, signed and dated. We would ask that even where there are no amendments to the data collection sheet, parents return the form, signed and dated.

Alcester Academy requests that if you change your contact number, move home or there are any other circumstances which may impact your child, the school is notified as a priority.

N.B. \*The Education Act 1996 defines a 'parent' as a). any natural parent, whether married or not, b). any parent who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility as defined in the Children Act (1989) for a child or young person c). any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person.

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

## **UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS**

The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate.

It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'.

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

Leave of Absence taken in the academic year 2024-25

The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.

- Penalty Notices are issued to <u>each parent of each absent child</u>, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means <u>each</u> parent will receive 2 invoices – 4 in total).
  - First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 each child if paid within 21 days.
  - Second Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): The amount of £160 paid within 28 days. No reduced amount.
- Payment plans will not be offered and/or payments received outside of the 28 day period will not be accepted.
   Where a penalty notice expires unpaid the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider criminal prosecution.
- Third Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): A
  penalty notices will not be issued, and the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal
  Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under S444 of Education Act 1996.




