with restricting any transfer of COVID. I can confirm at the point of writing this bulletin, that there are absolutely no confirmed cases of COVID in school. Should any cases of COVID develop in school, I will inform you as parents and carers in order that you can be vigilant. We will also notify parents and carers if your child has shared a bubble with any individuals affected, or a bus journey. Please be assured that I guarantee a continued, open and transparent line of communication with you all. In return, I would ask for your support with any future measures that we may have to take in order to restrict cases across the school. The staff are working so very hard to continue to teach as normal whilst dashing to and from numerous year group bubbles and classrooms. By doing this we have managed to maintain core subject teaching sets and the 'right teacher in front of the right group'. I thank them immensely for their efforts this week. We have all had to invest in plasters and comfy shoes as the week has progressed!

I was uplifted to hear from new staff this week about the positive conduct of our students in comparison to their experiences in other schools. Again, of course I know this but it is delightful to hear all the same. My week has been spent largely on duty. A much higher volume of staff are present around the school in order to help out. The staff team agreed to this as part of our return plan. Our midday supervisors have been such an asset agreeing to be in school from break time onwards also to help monitor bubble social areas. I anticipate a few adjustments needed to routines initially and we will talk these through carefully with students.

I have spent a considerable amount of time this week either liaising with Warwickshire transport, or you as parents about this. Transport continues to be an area that I am not quite satisfied with and I have added some notes later on in the bulletin to identify the issues that we are facing. Students still do not have allocated seats on some transport and this is required in order to identify 'bubbles' if a COVID case is identified. If you can support this drive as parents, I'd be very grateful therefore.

Mrs Woodman and staff have begun looking at data, tracking and how we might operate future Parents' Evenings, and Miss Buckthorp and her LSU team have mobilised and continue to provide such amazing care for the students as they return Headteacher

within each year group bubble area. Please be in touch if you need any support. I have been excited to visit year 9 option classes as students embark upon their GCSE pathways; Mr Hollis' Further Maths group was incredible and I look forward to visiting far more students next week. Mrs Stedman commented on the amazing attitude of her year 10 Geography class in their first lesson and Miss Bishop highlighted some incredible contributions from year 11 boys especially in History. We're back! We did it! And...thank you all for supporting this!

I hope that you are reassured by the school updates from the children each day and that you are able to re-establish the 'new normal' in your homes now. Please let us support you. I'm very conscious about the new 'rule of 6' that is established on Monday. I ask that you seriously talk to your children about respecting this in order to keep us all safe please. I would also ask that you continue to speak to children about the need to wear face coverings. Not only do I have a duty of care to the students and your families, but I do also to our staff. Many staff have supported family members shielding during these times and I would encourage students to think beyond themselves right now. Whilst this is not about me, as an example I haven't been in to my own parents' home since March in order to protect them and my amazing but very vulnerable dad! This is very common occurrence across a lot of the staff and I'd like the students to appreciate the lengths that staff are going to in order to provide a full education for them all.

Finally we are looking forward to resuming Rock Academy safely next week. Mr Badham has contacted parents about this and we have risk assessed the activity fully. It is so exciting! We are also looking forward to meeting year 5 and 6 parents for our Virtual Open Week 2020 next week as a very alternative type of event! I wrote the following message to parents on a particular bus route this week:

Please can I urge you to discuss the importance of wearing a face covering on public transport with your children. The school has gone to the greatest lengths to establish safe and clear boundaries in school in order to protect all children and staff and these are now frankly being undermined by the students not wearing face coverings on the transport that they use to, and from school. I am aware that some children are continuing to wear masks and I thank them for this.

The safe continuation of the school operating on a daily basis for all students is based upon them respecting that we are safest when following the guidance in place. I urge you to discuss this with you child and I thank you for your support and cooperation.

If your children do not wish to wear their masks in open areas of school for themselves, I ask them to respect the staff and their peers and please wear a face covering to protect us all. Many staff are still trying to be in school for the children whilst protecting their own family members as much as possible. The same goes for the walk in and out of school. Thank you.

#### Break time - use of cash

We have five separate trolley services running at break time for the students. It would be extremely helpful if the students had coins to speed up the transactions required. I completely understand that this contradicts COVID advice and suggest that the students might wish to wear disposable gloves and sanitise before eating. The only solution to this is not to serve food and we really do not want to do this. The canteen staff have struggled this week to provide enough change for the numbers of notes given. Obviously we are considering other options as the routines begin to settle. If parents are uncomfortable about the use of coins, I completely understand and students can bring in their own food. Thank you.

#### Illness

#### **School Photos**

The school photographer will be in for years 7-10 on 22nd September. We will send out a school comms nearer the time. We have been assured of the safety aspects in place to do this. Children will not be sat down to have photos taken and will be organised within their year group bubbles. If you do not want your child/ren involved in this opportunity email admin@alcesteracademy.org.uk I have been assured that the team will have 3 ply face masks, surgical gloves, hand sanitizer. They will be working at a distance of 7ft from pupils and it will be the responsibility of children and parents for uniform and hair, (tidy & straight collars etc). We are using Brainswick as a company and I am in receipt of their COVID risk assessment. Year 11 photos will take place in the new year.



To help keep your child and fellow student's safe, your child should not come to school if:

- They are feeling unwell or are experiencing any coronavirus symptoms (If in doubt, book a test. If positive, isolate for 10 days from start of symptoms)
- They have tested positive for coronavirus and are within the 10 day isolation period
- They are sharing a household or support bubble with someone with symptoms (person with symptoms to be tested, if negative can return to usual activities; if positive, you must isolate for 14 days from last contact)
- They have been advised by the NHS test and trace service to self-isolate or aware they are a close contact of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (isolate for 14 days from last contact)
- They have returned from abroad and government guidance states they need to quarantine for 14 days

If you are not sure if you child should or should not go to school please call your school reception.



#### Keeping you safe: Getting tested.

If anyone develops a new or persistent cough, temperature, or loss of smell or Taste:

- They need to self-isolate for 10 days. They need to isolate WITH household members immediately. Even if household members do not have symptoms, they may need to self-isolate for 14 days \*dependant on COVID-19 test result. Follow national guidance on how to self-isolate
- Book a test (the test must be taken within 3 days of symptoms starting, and no later than 5 days)

#### What is the process to book a test?

- You book at test at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test">https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</a> or call 119.
- You will enter your postcode into the online system and it will give you options
  of a drive thru test or a walk thru test (figure 1) this will be part of the call
  with 119.
- If you have transport available please attend a drive thru or walk thru testing
  site rather than ordering a home test. Testing at these sites tend to be quicker
  to produce results which help us to manage cases more quickly and
  effectively. However if you need to get a bus to attend a walk through site,
  order a home test immediately.
- Test slots are released every day at 8pm for the next day, regardless of working day or weekend. Test sites and availability may change.


