Saturday School – year 11

Thanks to staff, students and parents for supporting last Saturdays MFL session. It was a superb turn out with a lovely atmosphere. Tomorrow is slightly different as we are running our Geography session via Google Meet. Details have been sent out. We're keen to know how this goes.

Year 11 mocks

After hearing the news about no exams being held now for year 11s in Wales next summer, the

mocks that we are holding in the next few weeks are more important than ever if England decide to use centre assessed grades again. We will approach the preparation and execution of the exams as thoroughly as ever and hope that the students realise how important these may become. 3:2 days start on Thursday 26th November. For year 7 students, this will be new and we will take children through the concept carefully. We convert to three lessons before lunchtime and two afterwards in order to facilitate exams. There are no bubble changes, we just move the day by the hour required for an earlier lunchtime.

Future Parents' Evenings



We will be trialling the video system *School Cloud* https://www.schoolcloud.co.uk/ for year 9 Parents' Evening on Thursday 3rd December. Optimistically this should facilitate you meeting virtually with your child's teachers. We are working to make this as effective as possible right now. We would ask year 9 parents and carers to work together with us on our first attempt using this. Hopefully moving forward then we can use this platform for all further Parents' Evenings. I'm going to be using this as the platform for my own daughter's sixth form parents' evening next Thursday and so I'll keep an keen eye out on how it works from a parent perspective and feedback to you next week.

Assemblies

We are pleased to say that we are resuming themed assemblies albeit virtually still. Mr Cooke spoke about Remembrance on Wednesday in a live whole school link and next week we are thinking about 'anti bullying' together.

Funding

Careers was successful in securing £2,000 from The Future Careers Fund – Skills for Employment. This money is to be spent on providing Virtual Work Experience opportunities for our year 10 students. Stretch Development, providing us with lifetime access to motivational talks by David Hyner this will help our year 11 students aim higher, by raising their aspirations and equipping them with

essential skills and confidence. Young Enterprise, to motivate our year 10 students to succeed in the changing world of work by preparing them with the work skills, knowledge and confidence they will need.

Universal Music UK Sound Foundation Grant

Coronavirus Updates

When a case is confirmed please could I urge parents to read the letters sent out extremely carefully. In last weeks bulletin, I outlined the tiered approach to these and there are subtle differences to reflect:

(Read the bold at the top of the letter to support you further)

Letter A - your child has been in close contact and should self isolate.

Letter B - READ CAREFULLY. Your child is in

the same year group bubble and may have used the same classrooms etc but DOES NOT have to self isolate. Watch them carefully for symptoms developing though.

Letter C - to the rest of the school as information only. This will outline what year group the confirmed case is in.

We react quickly when we hear that there is a case. Often this has been at weekends or of an evening. If you could read letters carefully, it might avoid unnecessary queries. All information is outlined for you in these letters. Thank you.

Work for students self-isolating

Work for students self-isolating will be set via normal google classrooms. Students have the codes for these but they are on the website if needed.

If there happens to be no work posted, please go to the 'self-isolation classrooms'. Again codes are on the website.

Our reception continue to get lots of queries about this. The children have been shown where this work is now on several occasions.

Understanding

Can I reiterate that your support is really needed at this time please. We cannot do anything more to minimise risks or spread of the virus and we are obliged to isolate children within close contact of a confirmed case for fourteen days. We have no choice about this I'm afraid. Where we can, we do this at the weekend in order to give you time as parents to sort childcare, or a learning environment at home if required.

In my experience since March, I am extremely satisfied with our routines and remote offer at Alcester Academy compared to schools nationally. We MUST work together right now please. The biggest help you can give us right now is supporting us with children wearing face coverings in class and corridors. Not a legal requirement in class but very helpful in order to keep cases down.

In the midst of some frustration on Saturday night, I thank the parent who wrote me an uplifting message - much appreciated indeed! It is very unfortunate that year 9 has encountered three cases to date.

Parent illness

PHE tell us that transmission from adults is still the highest incidence rate of the virus. Please do not send children in to school therefore if you have symptoms yourself. We appreciate this. If children are ill, also apply caution and keep them off school until they are feeling better or tested negative. You've all been amazing with this and I thank you on behalf of staff.

Winter package to support families

There is a new guidance document outlining the support intended for families over the winter coronavirus period. Winter package to provide further support for children and families.


