Year 9 Students Meet Award-Winning Author Jonathan Stroud

On Thursday, year 9 had the opportunity to join together with our Three Rivers Alliance schools for an exciting author visit from Jonathan Stroud. Jonathan Stroud is the author of several internationally bestselling and award-winning novels, including the Bartimaeus series, Lockwood & Co. (now adapted into a number-one Netflix series), and The Outlaws Scarlett & Browne.

Held at K.E.S in Stratford, Jonathan shared his insights as a fictional writer. He talked about his journey into writing, the inspiration behind characters and the publishing process—he even shared behind the scenes images from the Netflix series set! Jonathan then shared how he would draw his characters to help him visualise them in his narrative, and we also got an insight into the costume that he would imagine one of his characters wearing. Of course, we also had the privilege of listening to him read an excerpt from one of his novels.



At the end of the session, some of our students got the chance to meet him and have their Lockwood books signed.

Jonathan Stroud top tip: when writing a fictional novel, start with the character that you want to base your novel on, and then be creative from there and see where it takes you!

This was an engaging and powerful opportunity for the Alliance and our year 9 students really did us proud.

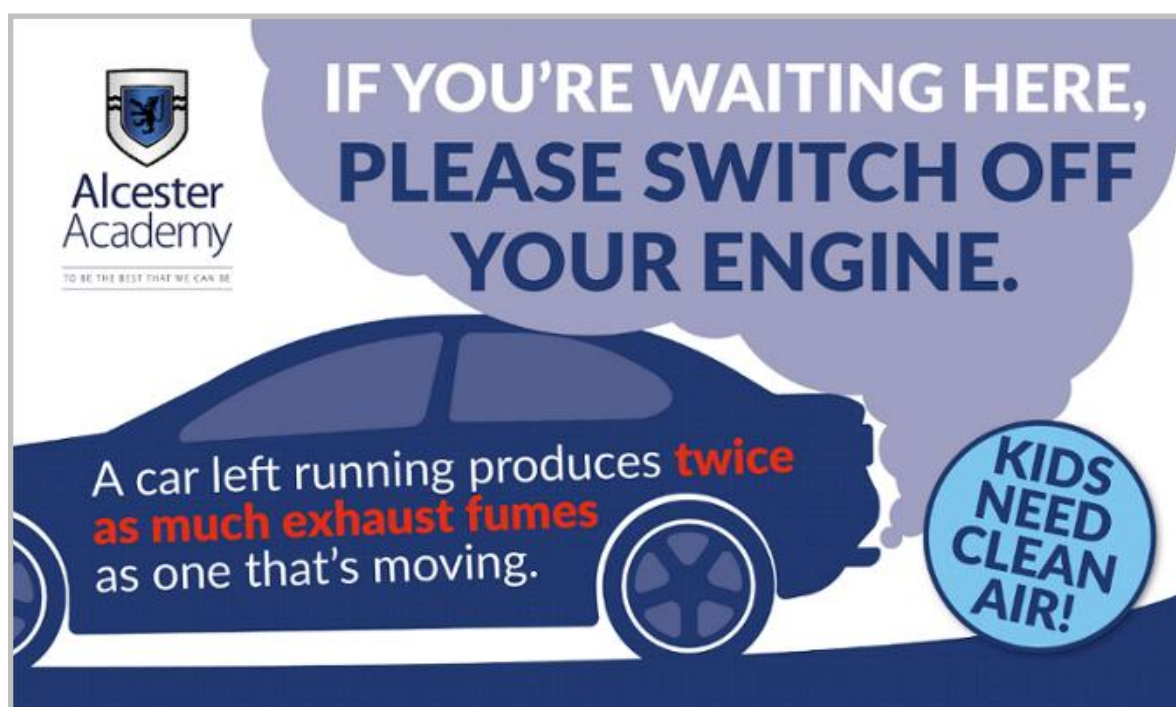

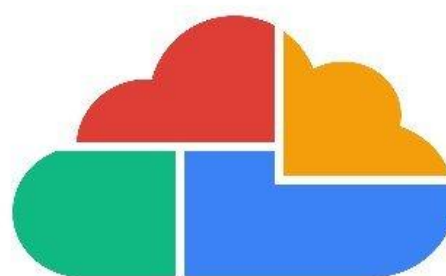

If a pupil is ten minutes late to school or lessons each day, they will miss seven days of learning over a year.



DfE data shows that pupils with more than 95% attendance achieve better GCSE results!

Key reasons why 95% attendance is important to Alcester Academy

Academic attainment

High attendance is directly linked to better results. Primary students with 95–100% attendance have 30% higher odds of reaching expected standards in reading, writing, and maths, with even higher impact in secondary school.

Preventing Persistent Absence

Anything below 95% is considered "not good enough" and may require intervention. Dropping below 90% is classified as persistent absence, limiting a child's chance of success.

Cumulative loss of learning

95% attendance means missing about 9-10 days per academic year. While this is the acceptable standard, any further absences drastically reduce the chances of reaching target grades.

Future earnings and opportunities

Missing school affects long-term prospects. Persistently absent secondary pupils could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to those with near-perfect attendance.

Social development

Regular attendance helps students build lasting friendships, confidence with peers, and familiarity with routines.

If your child is struggling to be in school regularly, please take time to talk to them over the Easter break and see what barriers they feel are impacting them. We hold regular support meetings with parents and students to look at the support available to ensure regular attendance.
