I certainly found it extremely useful to hear from parents and carers about the barriers being faced each day, whilst we begin to consider how we might support these areas more effectively.

Updates for 2026



- You should have received information about your child's tutor for September 2026, along with their contact details.
- Miss Buckthorp has sent a reminder about uniform expectations for the new term. The only change is the expectation regarding girls' skirt lengths. All students have had a reminder in a specific assembly this week, too. This assembly spoke about

student conduct in the community over the summer and reminded students again, about the perils of swimming, or playing in open water.

We ran an attendance knock out competition through the duration of the World Cup. Our winners were the boys from 9NA who finished the competition with a fantastic 100%.





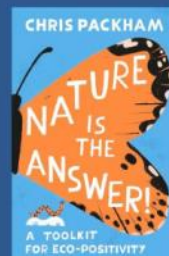
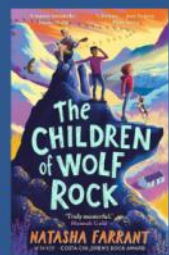
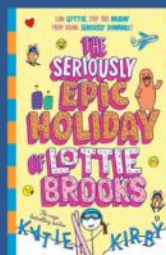
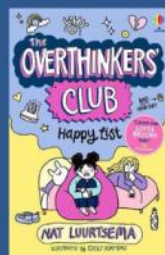
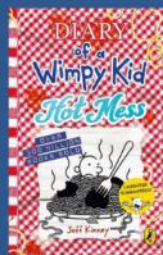
