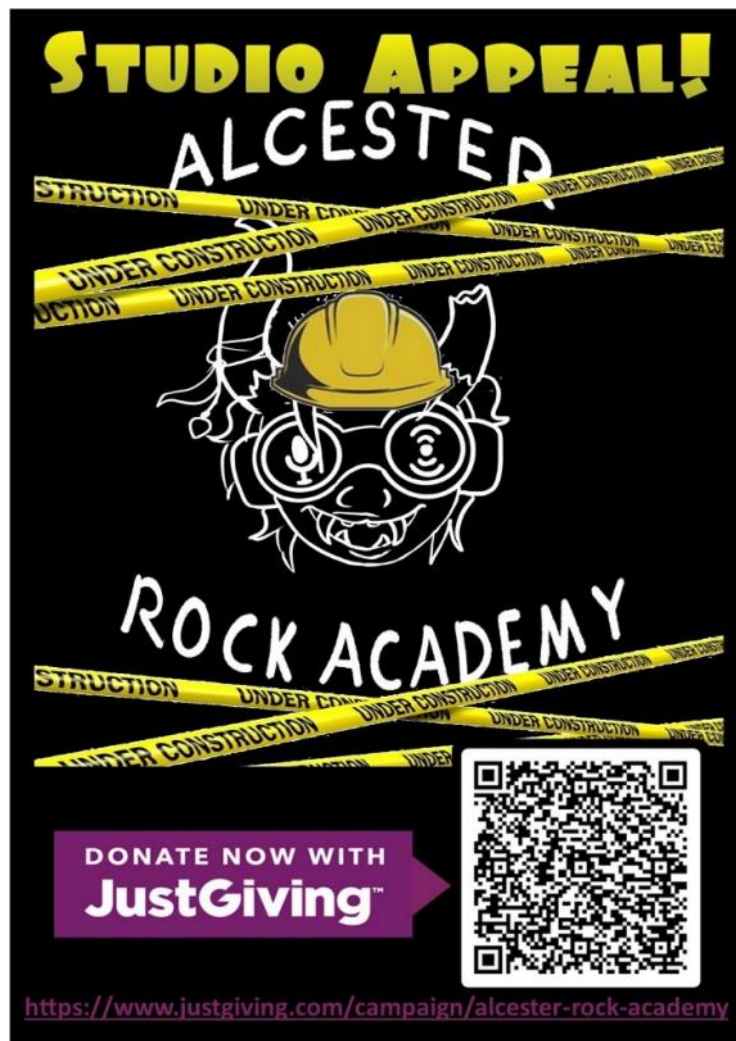

If your child is absent from school, please inform the Attendance Officer, Mrs Louise Hatcher, of the reason before 9.30am each day. This can be done through SchoolComms, by calling 01789 762285, or by emailing louisehatcher@alcesteracademy.org.uk.

The rules on taking children out of school for a holiday are set to become stricter, with tougher penalties to take effect at the start of the next school year.

From August 2024, parents who take their children on term-time holidays will face fines of £160 each, which could even lead to imprisonment. The fines will increase along with a new national framework that requires schools to consider fines when a child misses ten or more sessions (equivalent to five school days) without authorisation or medical evidence.

England saw nearly 400,000 penalty notices handed out in the previous academic year for unauthorised holidays during term-time. Parents are being urged to prioritise their child's education and follow attendance regulations to avoid serious legal consequences.

We were lucky to have Kathryn Beaver, an ex-pupil visit us this week in the DT department.

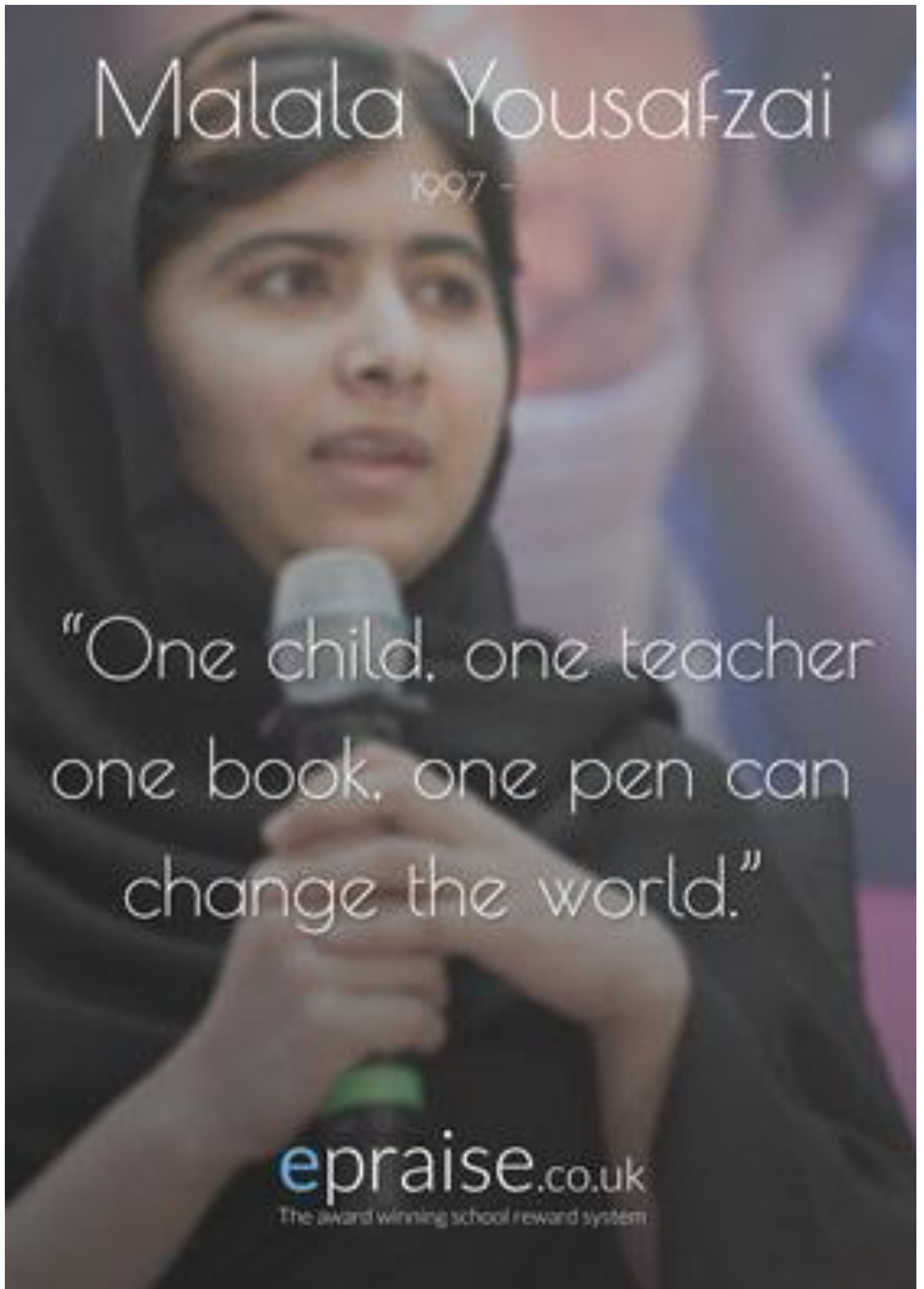
Kathryn left here and went on to study at AGS, from there she secured a place at De Montford University to study fashion. Kathryn is in her second year and decided to focus on knitwear.

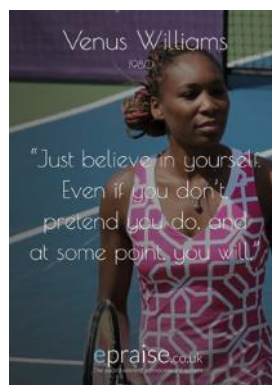
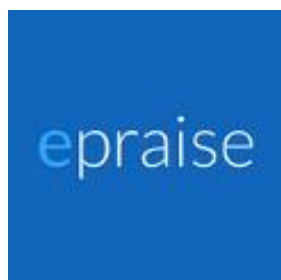

As a small department, flexibility and teamwork is particularly important. An ability to teach physics at Key Stage 4 would be desirable, however not essential. At KS4 both combined and triple science is offered. We currently work with AQA.
