Parents Evening Feedback

Thank you for the 359 responses regarding parents' evening for the next academic year. The responses were as follows:

- 60.7% of parents prefer to stay with School Cloud
- 13.1% of parents had no preference
- 26.2% of parents wish to return to face to face meetings.

Slightly more year 9 parents responded than those in other year groups.

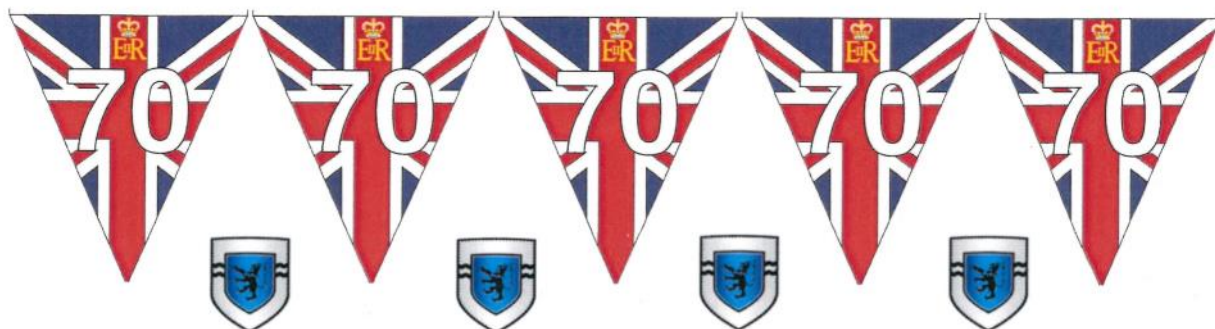

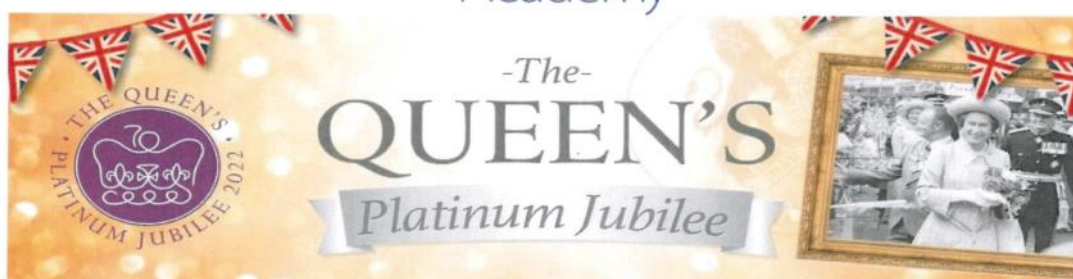

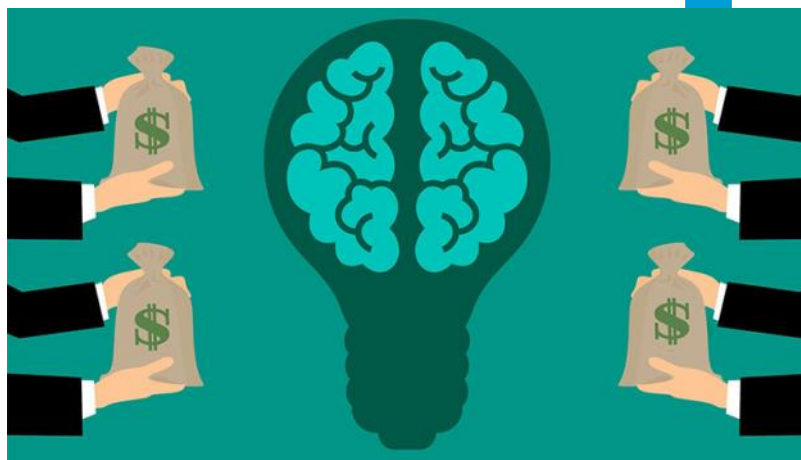




Virtual Workshop: The Money Game - How Science Works

This week the second year 8 science group participated in a STEM workshop, following the first group who participated last week.

During *The Money Game* workshop, led by the Natural History Museum, year 8 pupils had to listen to pitches made by three different research project leads who were all after 1 million pounds in funding. Working in groups to represent three different environmental companies, year 8 had to listen carefully to the information, ask further questions, and decide who they wanted to fund and how they wanted to split their money.



The projects requesting funding included an energy saving DNA storage project, a sustainable farming project, and a bivalves vs climate change project. After much deliberation, each group concluded that the sustainable farming project should be awarded the most money. The reasons given by year 8 were fantastic and included that the farming industry would open more opportunity for jobs, it would reduce climate change, and would help developing countries improve their economy – a great decision!

About the Platinum Jubilee

This year, the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II will be celebrated! This means She has been Queen for 70 YEARS! But what is a jubilee?

A jubilee is a special anniversary of an event, especially one celebrating twenty-five or fifty years of a reign or activity! Special jubilees are named after precious stones or metals this jubilee is 70 years and the stone is platinum.

The first British monarch to mark a jubilee in a significant way was King George III. The Golden Jubilee of George III on 25th October 1809 marked the forty-ninth anniversary of his accession and his entrance into the 50th year of his reign. Queen Elizabeth II celebrated her Silver Jubilee in 1977. She celebrated her Ruby Jubilee in 1992, her Golden Jubilee in 2002, her Diamond Jubilee in 2012, and her Sapphire Jubilee in 2017.

The London Underground has a line named after the Queen's Silver Jubilee, adequately named the Jubilee Line! The Jubilee Line's colour is light grey, representing the silver colour of the Jubilee itself.

Fun facts about the reign of Queen Elizabeth I.

The Queen has carried out more than 21,000 engagements over the course of her reign.

The Queen has sent over 300,000 congratulatory cards to people celebrating their 100th birthdays, and over 900,000 messages to couples marking their Diamond (60th) Wedding Anniversaries.

There have been 14 Presidents of the United States during Her Majesty's reign, and, with the exception of President Johnson (1963-9), Her Majesty has met each one.

Her Majesty has owned more than 30 Corgis and Dorgis during her reign, most of which have been descended from her first Corgi, Susan, who was gifted to her on her eighteenth birthday in 1944.

In 1997 The Queen launched Buckingham Palace's first official website, in 2014 she sent her first tweet and in 2019 published her first Instagram post.

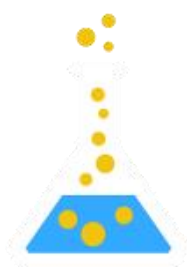

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of *Platt v Isle of Wight Council* which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council

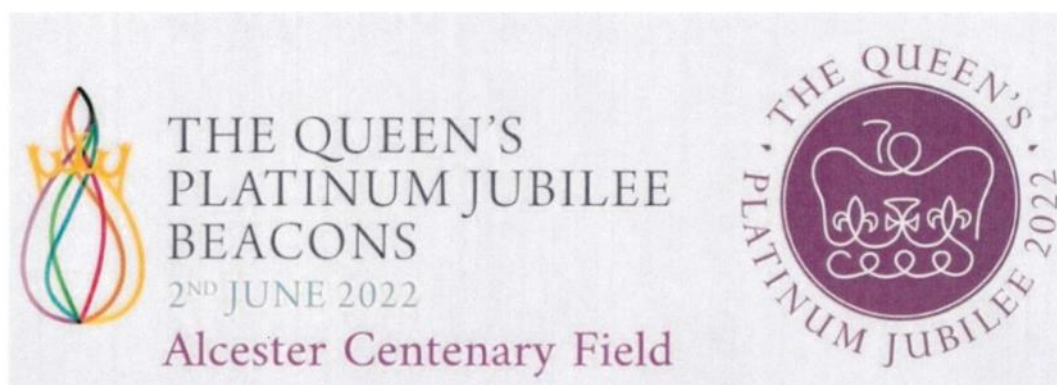
It is important to note, Fixed Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices in the amount of £120 each, totalling £240 for both children, this is reduced to £60 per child if paid within 21 days).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices.
