



Annual trip to Warwick Castle


It was my absolute pleasure to have organised the skating reward trips which went out on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th December.






In summary, the guidance sets out how schools should handle requests for "social transitioning".

The DfE defines this as "actions such as changing







names, uniforms, or using different facilities to help a child appear more like the opposite sex, with the expectation that they will be treated as if they are". The guidance sets out five "overarching principles" for schools to frame responses to requests for social transitioning.

These are as follows:

- Schools and colleges have statutory duties to safeguard and promote the welfare of all children
- Schools and colleges should be respectful and tolerant places where bullying is never tolerated
- Parents should not be excluded from decisions taken by a school or college relating to requests for a child to 'socially transition'
- Schools and colleges have specific legal duties that are framed by a child's biological sex
- There is no general duty to allow a child to 'social transition'

Well done to Skye in year 9 who has helped to raise £646 for Shelter. Skye has done some amazing work for charity this year. Thank you!














Thank you Lydia in year 7 for helping out at a special Myton Hospice Christmas event recently.

New technology— Clever Touch screens


We have been excited to receive several Clever Touch screens over the last week. The students should find these an exciting new piece of equipment within classrooms.

I am very aware that the students have made it through one of the longest terms that I can remember. They have behaved exceptionally this week and shown a brilliant level of control in







The science department is proud of the progress that students make. As a team, we have an established record of excellent results; in 2022 results far exceeded National Averages: P8 for the whole school was +0.46 and science achieved a VA of +0.55. In 2023 86% achieved a minimum of 2 grade 4s in science with 71% achieving at least 2 grade 5s. Applicants will be considered from all points of experience, including early career teachers. 
Year 7 Cell Models


