Dear parents and carers,

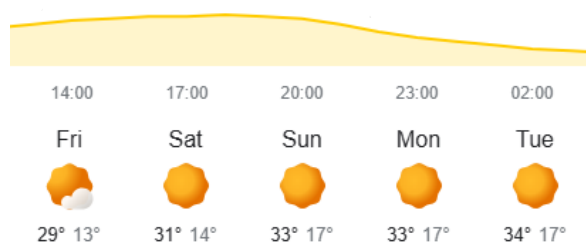
Good afternoon. I'm certain that you'll agree, it is lovely to see the warmer weather creeping back in time for half term.

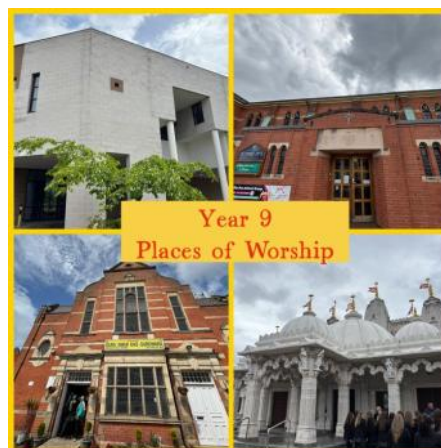

Access arrangements for exams

We are receiving a growing number of requests for children to have extra support directly before exam periods start in school. I refer to readers, scribes, laptops or extra time, as just some examples.

The JCQ guidance for allowing students to have support for external exams such as GCSEs has changed considerably this year. Unless your child has had support as a normal way of working throughout the school, we are unable to grant additional access at GCSE time. Children are required to be assessed for their needs in school by a qualified specialist teacher. The growing number of children in school with identified needs means that this assessment has to be carefully planned in advance and we cannot instantly apply access arrangements to students, I'm afraid.

After reporting that our administrator Miss Emma Home is leaving, in last week's edition, this will give our new weekly bulletin editor some time to get used to their staff role within the school. DfE data shows that pupils with more than 95% attendance achieve better GCSE results!

Key reasons why 95% attendance is important to Alcester Academy

Academic attainment

High attendance is directly linked to better results. Primary students with 95–100% attendance have 30% higher odds of reaching expected standards in reading, writing, and maths, with even higher impact in secondary school.

Preventing Persistent Absence

Anything below 95% is considered "not good enough" and may require intervention. Dropping below 90% is classified as persistent absence, limiting a child's chance of success.

Cumulative loss of learning

95% attendance means missing about 9-10 days per academic year. While this is the acceptable standard, any further absences drastically reduce the chances of reaching target grades.

Future earnings and opportunities

Missing school affects long-term prospects. Persistently absent secondary pupils could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to those with near-perfect attendance.

Social development

Regular attendance helps students build lasting friendships, confidence with peers, and familiarity with routines.

If your child is struggling to be in school regularly, please take time to talk to them over the Easter break and see what barriers they feel are impacting them. We hold regular support meetings with parents and students to look at the support available to ensure regular attendance.
