## WARWICKSHIRE SECONDARY BOOK AWARD

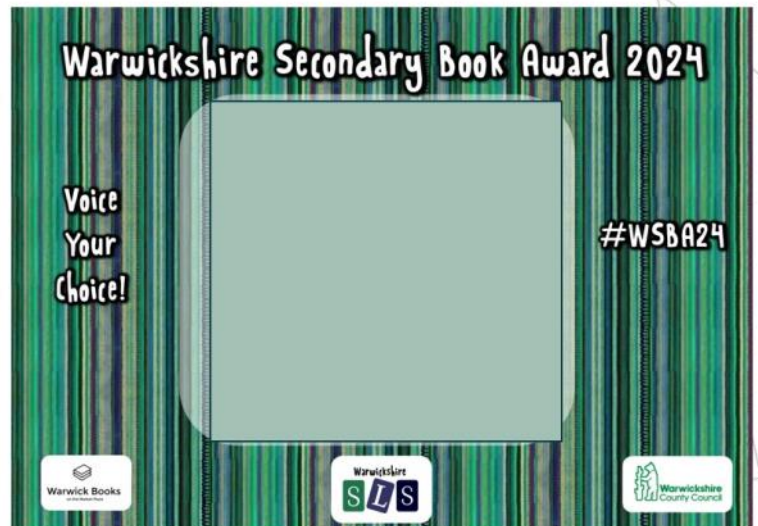
17 students from years 7 and 8 have been invited to take part this year! If you registered your interest, look out for an invite in your Gmail account.

### This week's sport roundup: Girls Indoor Rowing Competition

The South Warwickshire Girls Indoor Rowing Tournament took place at Alcester Academy this year. It was great to see eight boats entered into both age groups. Each girl rowed an individual race – 2 minutes for the year 7/8 girls and 3 minutes for the year 9/10 girls. Both age groups then did an 8 minute relay, changing the rower every minute. We entered one team into the year 7/8 competition, Felicity (Oversley), Tilly (Oversley), Lily (Ragley) and Daisy (Greville) finished 3rd overall with a combined distance of 1901m. Felicity achieved our top individual distance of 487m.

We entered two teams into the older age group. Emily (Ragley), Evin (Billesley), Olivia (Billesley) and Jess (Oversley) finished a very creditable 5th overall with a combined distance of 1822m. Summer (Billesley), Georgia (Ragley), Amelia (Greville) and Chloe (Billesley) finished in an amazing 2nd position overall with a distance of 1996m. Their top individual distances were from Summer year 10: 721m and Georgia year 9: 720m.

An wonderful performance from all the girls but most importantly they demonstrated outstanding team work and supported each other brilliantly along with Emmy and Jess who came to support with relay changeovers!
