

Confirmed cases

Can I ask you that if you have children isolated from other school or social bubbles at home, you let us know again as soon as possible. The South Warwickshire schools are trying to work together as closely as possible on this and your support is helpful also.

Face Coverings



It should be a matter of routine now that students wear face covering to and from, and around school. This is helping tremendously. The routes and bubble routines are also assisting a lot. We've refined a few bubbles this week in order to make lunchtime run a bit more efficiently.

Year 8s

I have received a few year 8 parental questions about this bubble sitting on stools and not chairs in their allocated classrooms. In order to facilitate a full student return in September, we had no choice but to use the science classrooms and facilities. I am looking at alternatives all of the time and I thank students and parents for understanding this under difficult circumstances right now. I am working on an idea to help this situation.

Purchasing Lunch

With new routines in place:

Year 7s – will use canteen cards at lunchtime

Year 8s - canteen cards

Year 9s – canteen cards

Year 10s – cash (students to inform canteen staff if they require money taken off their canteen card)

Year 11s – canteen cards

All students will continue to use cash at break times if they wish to purchase food. This is because we operate a trolley service in each bubble area.

Sanctions

In order to maintain high standards within school at this time, we have made refinements to our behaviour policy. These changes will be published to you



next week once Governors have ratified them. It will be no surprise to you that the changes are designed to promote safe and appropriate behaviours at this difficult time linked specifically to coronavirus. We have also refined the detention system so that subject detentions after school happen on just one day after school (Thursday) for 40 minutes. These will run concurrently with Academy Detentions for 1 hour. If students have to sit a detention after school, it will be within their own bubble to continue to adhere to legislation and safety. I'd appreciate it if you would talk to the students about the standards expected so that we continue to keep detentions to a minimum at this time.

240 Bus

Students travelling on the 240 bus have been told this week that they must all wear their face coverings whilst travelling after reports that this was not happening. I am working with the Director of Education on transport safety along with our Chair of Governors. Children failing to adhere to this rule may be refused the right to travel.

As always, no exposed flesh, short shorts or spaghetti straps please. (Appropriate casual wear for a school environment should be worn).





ALCESTER ROCK ACADEMY

Here's some info all about the Alcester Rock Academy!

"Alcester Rock Academy is a unique opportunity for Guitarists, Bassists, Drummers, Keyboard players and Vocalists to get together and learn to play in a band under the supervision of expert tutors."

The Rock Academy is situated in the Alcester Academy music block.

Each Rock Academy session consists of five bands each in their own fully kitted out practice room, working on material for an up and coming gig. The bands are given expert guidance Renny Badham (Rock Academy manager and guitar / bass teacher) and Matthew Green (Pro drum / percussionist and teacher).

The age range is from 10 to 18. Bands are generally put together initially using similar age groups.

There are three main Rock Academy concerts every year. A themed concert at Alcester Academy in November (sponsored by Upstage Lighting who have provided us with a state of the art prolighting rig for every concert since 2007 free of charge); Acoustic Night at a local venue in April and The Summer Bash in July.

In between these main concerts Alcester Rock Academy perform at local events / festivals such as Alcester Street market and Alne - Fest.

We run two separate Rock Academy sessions each week for ten weeks of each term.

We have a Wednesday session from 4 – 4.30pm
And a Saturday session from 10 – 11.30am
Each session costs £6.00 per student i.e. £60.00 per term

History

Alcester Rock Academy came about due to Alcester Academy (then known as Alcester high school Technology) College achieving Music College Status back in 2006. The Rock Academy was, and is a community based initiative and its members are from schools and colleges from the local area. We have, and have had pupils attending from Alcester Academy, St Benedicts R.C. High school, Alcester Grammar, King Edward VI Grammar, Studley High school, Stratford High School, , Chipping Campden High school, Bidford Primary, Dunnington Primary and St Nicholas Primary School Alcester and Great Alne Primary School.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council

It is important to note, Fixed Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices in the amount of £120 each, totalling £240 for both children, this is reduced to £60 per child if paid within 21 days).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices.
