Congratulations to Garan, year 7 for his good deed this week. This certainly showed Academy values in action.



Year 7 Transition Questionnaire Results

Many thanks to our year 7 parents for completing our transition survey. As a school we are delighted by the results, and thank you for such positive comments and suggestions. We have taken these on board as we plan our transition this year.

- 97% of parents felt their child had settled in really well into year 7.
- 100% of you felt that the school had supported you and your child from primary transition through to starting year 7.
- 99% of you felt that the parents evening prior to induction day was informative about the routines of the school. There were some great comments about the communication you have received about the school, and in dealing with any issues that have arisen.
- 100% of those that attended our summer school felt that it helped their child prepare for their new school. This included meeting

the staff, getting to know their way around the school, making friends and also feeling less anxious about starting their new school.

The students also completed a survey about their transition. Again, comments were really positive. Students felt safe in school and felt that they would have someone to talk to if needed. Summer School had really helped to alleviate any nerves, and helped with making new friends for those that had attended, with lots of favourite activities.






What is Pancake Day?
