## Teaching and Learning..oops!

Teaching and Learning

...and last but not least, an apology to one of our most valued T&L colleagues, Miss Nemeshanyi, who was inadvertently missed from last week's bulletin...

As a practical subject teacher with visual outcomes, I have a strong interest in verbal feedback and its impact on progress and learning. We all know that providing timely, specific, and actionable feedback is one of the vital tools that helps students learn. However, it is essential to consider how the effect of feedback varies considerably depending on how it is delivered and received. With marking and feedback looking different in schools at present, due to the current restrictions, my focus in lessons has been on creating a dialogue with students that stretches their learning with higher-level open-ended questions and more informative explanations.

Effective feedback treats mistakes as important opportunities to learn. It stimulates students to try alternative strategies and to seek out additional resources to develop their knowledge, understanding, and skills (Cauley & McMillan 2010).



#### Warwickshire 9 Book Award – which book will be their favourite?


The ten year 9 students that committed themselves to this award have been fantastic, despite us not being able to run the award in the usual way.


