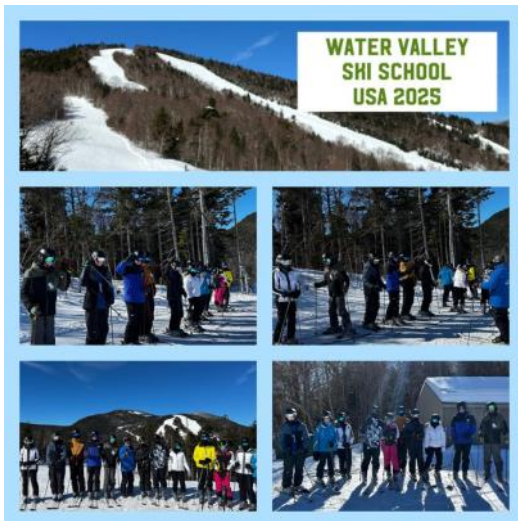

Mars Lander Challenge: A STEM Exploration

Our year 9 students took part in a day of problem solving on Wednesday, looking at ways to make a lander to land on Mars. They spent the day working in groups, problem solving and communicating to produce their prototype of a lander and a group presentation.

After three testers were designed and made, each group moved onto designing the final prototype whilst working to a budget. Team members each had separate roles and oversaw their own areas within the group. Working together, they also had to present their final product and explain the reasoning behind it. We then tested each lander to see who passed the challenge.

Alcester Academy Music Students Rock Liverpool

This Thursday, 27th February 2025, our year 10 and 11 music students, along with a group of year 8 aspiring musicians, embarked on an exciting trip to the British Music Experience in Liverpool. The day was packed with engaging workshops and a fascinating guided tour, leaving our students inspired and buzzing with musical energy.

The day began with the insightful *Pop Culture* workshop. This session delved into the social and political landscape of Britain since 1945, exploring how pivotal events and technological advancements have shaped the evolution of popular music.

Students learned about the diverse music and fashion trends that have emerged from various musical movements, gaining a deeper

understanding of the social and political forces behind these iconic styles.

Following this, our students had the opportunity to unleash their inner rock stars in the *Gibson Brands Interactive Studio*. This hands-on experience allowed students to try out a wide selection of Gibson guitars, including the Power Players, which are perfectly sized for younger musicians.

Alongside the guitars, students could experiment with industry-standard Roland keyboards and electric drums, all equipped with interactive tutorials catering to beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. The studio was a hive of activity, with students enthusiastically exploring different instruments.





Throughout the day, students also enjoyed a captivating guided tour of the British Music Experience's extensive exhibition. They explored the rich history of British music, from its origins to the present day, encountering iconic memorabilia and learning about the legendary artists who have shaped the nation's musical heritage.

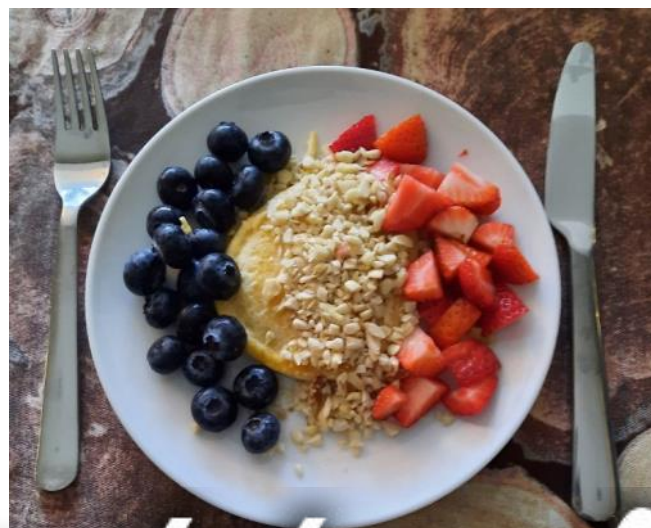

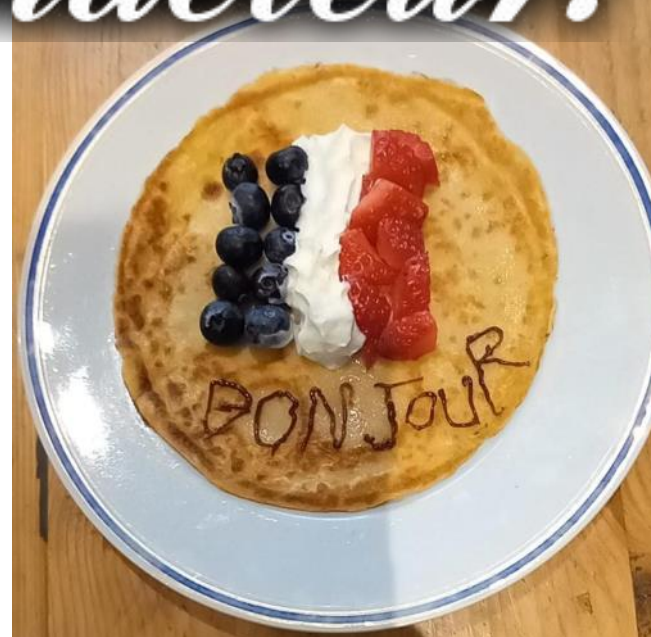

Celebrating World Book Day: Read Your Way!

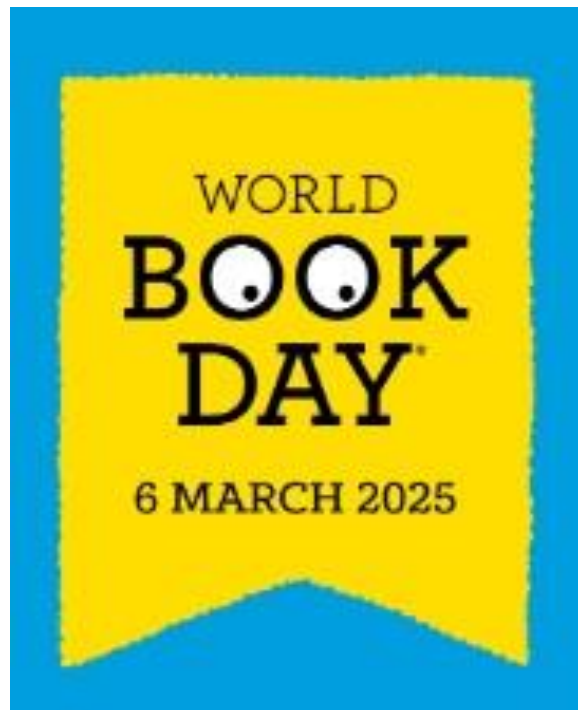
On Thursday 6th March, Alcester Academy will be celebrating World Book Day! This year's theme is based on the topic of *Read Your Way*.

This is achieved through one formal lesson each week. The knowledge, skills and understanding that pupils gain is also applied to other areas of the curriculum where ICT is used extensively. In year 8 pupils continue to develop their creative and problem solving skills and gain relevant experience to help prepare for their option choices. This is achieved through two lessons of ICT each week during year 8. Throughout year 7 and 8 pupils complete a range of interactive homework tasks each week independently using Google Classroom, and other online creative problem-solving activities.

During our three-year KS4 structure at Alcester Academy, two optional pathways are available in ICT and Computer Science; OCR Cambridge National in Creative iMedia (Levels 1&2), and OCR GCSE Computer Science. Pupils are encouraged to choose the pathway most appropriate to their ability and interests. Google Classroom is used extensively for both option choices, to deliver lesson and homework content.

The ICT and Computer Science department at Alcester Academy is proud of the progress pupils make. Courses delivered in recent years have been extremely successful. During 2024 pupils achieved: iMedia P+ = 88% D/D* = 50% and Computer Science 4+ = 89% 7+ = 44%. The successful applicant will be an outstanding classroom practitioner.
