Bridget Phillipson, Secretary of State for Education has said that:

'This guidance is intended to remove ambiguity and support firm, confident leadership. Schools should not only have clear policies, but should make sure those policies are applied consistently across classes and at all times, and we want parents to back these policies too. This is a clear national reset on mobile phone use in schools.'

She continued:

'You have my full support in taking this forward. Clear boundaries, applied with consistency and fairness, give pupils the best chance to learn and thrive, and schools should feel confident in setting and enforcing them.'

At Alcester Academy, we continue to deter the use, or ownership of smart phones for all year 7s. Largely, the students are respectful of the clear rules that we have had in place now for a number of years. As a reminder, we should not

see phones in school, and they should not be used. This latest update will be reviewed now by Governors and staff, and we will be in communication with you once we have had chance to reflect more.

In other news this week, we held the annual maths challenge, our new Student Health Ambassadors were trained at K.E.S., some of our year 9 and 10 students took part in the Debate Mate programme, and we welcomed some new trainee teachers in English, maths and science. Year 11s faced their controlled assessment in performing arts, and some visited **Stratford Girls' Grammar School for the afternoon** on Wednesday too.

The year 9 and 10 Scholars recently traded their pens for podiums as they participated in a high-energy workshop run by Debate Mate. Led by Law and Politics students from the University of Birmingham, our students spent the day mastering the art of persuasion.

Evidence-Led Excellence

The University mentors were particularly impressed by how effectively the Scholars backed up their claims. Students focused on the *REEL* structure (Reason, Evidence, Explanation, Link), proving that a strong argument is nothing without hard facts. Whether discussing local school issues or global economics, our students stood out for their ability to provide compelling, well-researched evidence to support their points.

The Big Wins

The afternoon reached a fever pitch with two major final debates:

Social Media Showdown: The year 10s tackled the motion that social media prevents meaningful relationships. Using sharp logic and data-driven rebuttals, the Proposition team convinced the audience to take the win.

MVP Performance: In the year 9 final, Kaitlyn delivered a standout performance, earning the title of MVP for her exceptional poise and evidence-based arguments.

The mentors praised the Scholars for their ability to disagree respectfully while maintaining high academic standards. Well done to all involved!






Alcester Academy is collecting school rucksacks (not handbags).
