Summer Weather—Uniform

Shorts make a come back after Easter if your child wishes to wear these. Shorts must be knee length, dark grey, tailored with no cargo pockets. Thank you. We love seeing these. They are only for the summer term.

Students should continue to wear ties and blazers. It is only in very extreme temperatures that we will relax this rule.

Girls can wear ankle socks with skirts. These should be grey, white or black and not trainer

socks. We encourage short black cycling shorts to be worn underneath skirts please and skirts should not be rolled up.

Berlin & Krakow History Trip

Last week some of our year 9 and 10 GCSE History students set off on a truly memorable trip to Berlin and Krakow, packed with fascinating sights, moving experiences, and a fair bit of fun along the way.

We kicked things off in Berlin with a brilliant three-hour walking tour of the city. Our guide brought the city's rich and often difficult history to life, taking us from the Brandenburg Gate to remnants of the Berlin Wall, and giving us a real sense of how the past continues to shape the





present. That evening, we headed out for a lovely meal before returning to the hotel for some well-deserved downtime—which turned into an impromptu karaoke night! Highlights included some impressive (and enthusiastic!) performances from students.

The next day, we visited the Reichstag, Topography of Terror Museum and Checkpoint Charlie, two powerful and thought-provoking sites that gave everyone a deeper understanding of life under the Nazi regime and during the Cold War.

After a full day, we boarded our overnight coach to Krakow – tired, but still in good spirits. In Krakow, we explored the Jewish Quarter and visited Schindler's

Factory, where students learned more about Jewish life before and during the Second World War. These visits sparked some really thoughtful conversations. That evening, we had some time to relax at the hotel and recharge.

While we were away, we also marked Mother's Day, and several students made a touching gesture by buying flowers for Miss Bishop and Mrs Marshall – a lovely moment of thoughtfulness that really stood out.

The next morning, we made our way to Auschwitz-Birkenau. It was a tough visit, but incredibly important, and our students were a credit to the school in the way they approached it—

showing real maturity, respect, and empathy throughout.

On our final day, we visited the beautiful Wieliczka Salt Mines, followed by some free time for shopping and exploring Krakow's charming Old Town. It was a great way to end the trip on a lighter note.

The students were absolutely fantastic from start to finish – polite, engaged, and supportive of one another throughout. We're so proud of how they represented the school and embraced every aspect of the trip. A huge thank you to them for making it such a special week!

Warwickshire Secondary Book Award 2025

Seven year 8 students and eight year 7 students have been eagerly reading and engaging in activities centred around six shortlisted books for the Warwickshire Secondary Book Award, organized by the School Library Service.

Last week, they cast their votes for their favourite titles, and on Wednesday 2nd April, they attended the Warwickshire Book Award Final at King's High School, Warwick. Four of the shortlisted authors were present, giving students the exciting opportunity to meet them, get books signed, and take photos. With over twenty schools from the Warwickshire area participating, the students selected *Quiet Storm* by Kimberly Whittam as their overall favourite.

We were also thrilled to celebrate a competition winner! Lydia (Billesley) won a prize for her outstanding drawing of a character from one of the shortlisted books. She used her creativity to illustrate her vision of a werewolf from *Bite Risk*, impressing the judges with her fantastic artwork.

The full list of shortlisted books for the 2025 award were: *Kofi and the Rap Battle Summer* by Jeffrey Boakye, *I Am Wolf* by Alastair Chisholm, *Bringing Back Kay-Kay* by Dev Kothari, *The Wrong Shoes* by Tom Percival, *Quiet Storm* by Kimberly Whittam and *Bite Risk* by S. J. Wills.



Oliwia (Greville) wrote—*During our first meeting, we got to look at all the books and make predictions on which book would be our favourite, based on the blurb. I chose Kofi and the Rap Battle Summer because it gave off a real-life situation feeling, so I felt like I'd be able to easily read through it and enjoy it. I was really confident within the first week because I finished my book in two days. Although I was really quick with that one, the next one took me longer because it was boring at the start, so I felt a little discouraged about it. I was always on track though, so I wasn't completely lost. The meetings in the library have helped as we got time to read and continue our competitions. Three Rivers Alliance Hosts Inaugural STEM Careers Fair in Stratford-Upon-Avon

Monday saw the first STEM careers fair between the Three Rivers Alliance held at the Crowne Plaza in Stratford-Upon-Avon. The event was funded by The Warwickshire Future Careers Fund to support collaborative projects between schools in the area. This was a huge undertaking, creating the opportunity for over 350 students from across the alliance to explore future career paths within the STEM industries.

Students all participated in a practical workshop with one of the following organisations: Coventry University, Godiva Ltd, Balfour Beatty, Risk Evolves or ROKE.

Following this, students navigated the main fair where the following companies were ready to

discuss future career options: LISI Aerospace, Playground Games, British Army, Pitlane Development, IDEX Corp, Constellium, Vets4Pets, Warwick University, Telnet Technology Services, Octopus Energy, Stratford-Upon-Avon College, Storm Geomatics, Wood PLC, Siemens Energy, Warwickshire Institute of Sport, Seven Trent Green Power, Andy Kowal Ski Consulting and the Canal & River Trust.

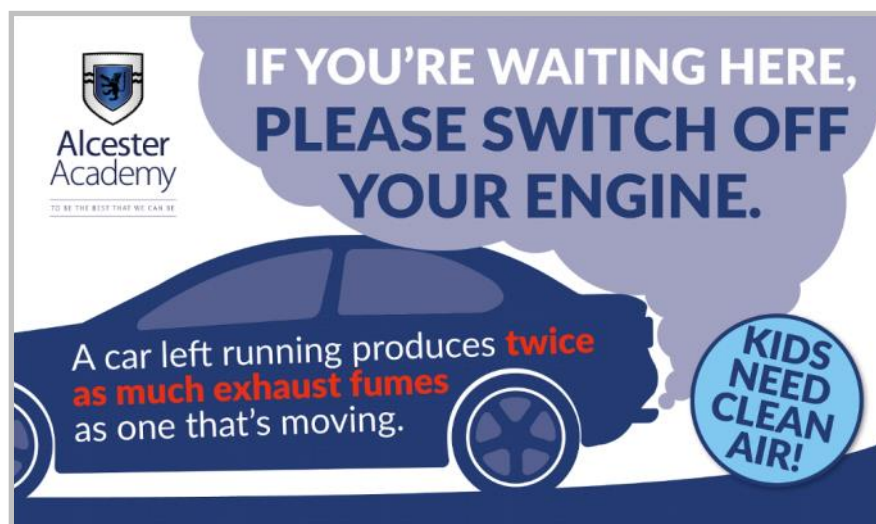
