A morning of numeracy and literacy: Welcoming year 6s to the Academy

On Tuesday, we had the opportunity to invite some of our most able year 6s into the Academy for a morning of numeracy and literacy.

The numeracy session focused on mathematical curiosity and discovery. Year 6 students were introduced to the fascinating world of the Möbius strip, which is a seemingly simple loop with some very surprising properties. Working practically, students made predictions about what might happen when the strip was cut in certain ways, before testing their ideas and recording the unexpected results. This led to brilliant discussions about shape, space and dimension. The year 6s showed fantastic reasoning and problem-solving skills throughout.

A huge thank you to our Student Numeracy Leaders, Sam (year 10), Sophia (year 10), Charlie (year 9), James (year 9), Milo (year 10), and Georgia

(year 10), who went above and beyond to set up and support the session.

After this, the year 6s got a chance to visit the LRC for a literacy session. In this, they explored what the word 'adventure' meant to them and how this might be seen within texts. They then completed their own literacy adventure by finding books in the LRC and then writing their own openings to these books. Thank you to our Student Librarians Jasmine (year 9) and Lily (year 9) for their brilliant support and book recommendations!

We were so impressed by the enthusiasm and commitment shown by our year 6s, and we look forward to seeing them fulfilling their potential when they start with us in September.



Last week year visited Cheddar Gorge to explore the limestone landscape as part of their *Geography Rocks* unit. This was a really fantastic experience for the students as many had not seen or been in a cave before.

This was also a first opportunity for many of them to undertake some fieldwork tasks in preparation for GCSE study next year.

It was amazing to see their faces as we entered Gough's Cave and saw the massive stalagmites and stalactites for the first time with our guide. Jacob's Ladder with its 278 steps presented no challenge and my group raced up in no time to take in the views of the area from the lookout tower!

Then there was just time at the end of the day for us to enjoy a cold drink and a cream at the café—a must on any geography trip!

The students asked insightful questions and learnt a great deal about cave formation. Great work year 8! You're going to smash GCSE geography next year.



Notice for Parents

To comply with the School Attendance (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2024 and Data Protection expectations, it is vitally important that Alcester Academy keeps accurate and up to date information relating to every pupil on roll.

The information we are required to record includes:

- Pupil's full legal name (and if appropriate, their preferred name).
- The name, address and contact details of every person known to the school/academy who is a parent* to the pupil with whom the pupil normally resides (this is the address that has been used to register with their GP).
- The name, address and contact details of any additional parent*.
- Any other emergency contact details.

In order to gather this information, every year we send out data collection forms. Parents are asked to complete the form with as much information as possible and then return to the school, signed and dated. We would ask that even where there are no amendments to the data collection sheet, parents return the form, signed and dated.

Alcester Academy requests that if you change your contact number, move home or there are any other circumstances which may impact your child, the school is notified as a priority.

N.B. *The Education Act 1996 defines a 'parent' as a). any natural parent, whether married or not, b). any parent who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility as defined in the Children Act (1989) for a child or young person c). any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate.

It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'.

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

Leave of Absence taken in the academic year 2024-25

The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.

- Penalty Notices are issued to <u>each parent of each absent child</u>, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means <u>each</u> parent will receive 2 invoices 4 in total).
 - First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 each child if paid within 21 days.
 - Second Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): The amount of £160 paid within 28 days. No reduced amount.
- Payment plans will not be offered and/or payments received outside of the 28 day period will not be accepted.
 Where a penalty notice expires unpaid the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider criminal prosecution.
- Third Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): A
 penalty notices will not be issued, and the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal
 Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under S444 of Education Act 1996.
