It's been another busy week here to include year 11s finishing off mock exams, many students taking controlled assessments, catch up for DT practical work and some important sporting fixtures for the upper school.



Caja takes part in the next round of the Rotary Young Chef Competition this weekend at Campion School, Leamington. We wish her every success with this!








#### **Family Support Worker Drop In**


World Thinking Day –22nd February 2024
