Dear Parent/Carer,

Following an absence of longer than 3 consecutive days for a student, we write to all parents and carers to provide support for catching up on school work *if* circumstances persist. We do appreciate that in some cases, children absent from school may not always be well enough to complete this.

The tables below include some guidance for core subjects. Pupils also have access to *Google Classroom* for all their subjects: it is recommended that pupils check whether there are resources and assignments available through this platform first.

This process should also be followed in the case of emergency closures and unforeseen absence.
