## **Peer Mentoring Proposal**

- Aim: To set up a peer mentoring programme at Alcester Academy that equips student mentors with relevant and parppriate training to be able to deliver sessions with younger students.
- To be led by the school leadership team but I see years 10 & 11 being involved in the provision of the mentoring programme & year 9 students supporting Year 6 transition

# Training will be provided by Kidscape:

Duration: Full day (maximum of 30 pupils; | Face-to-face classroom-based | Cost: £895

Our Peer Mentoring training is based on young people supporting one another. Through the training, staff will match mentors with mentees in one-on-one friendships so that they can provide guidance and support, serving as positive role models.

Our programme enables Peer Mentors to listen to and support fellow pupils (mentees); helping them deal with the current challenges they may be struggling with.

Our full-day interactive programme will provide young people with the knowledge, skills and tools to become confident Peer Mentors.

# **Learning outcomes**

- Recognise the benefits of a Peer Mentoring programme
- Understand what is involved in the Peer Mentoring process
- Share the key responsibilities of a Peer Mentor
- Recognise personal qualities and skills
- Have a greater awareness of safeguarding procedures
- Increased confidence to communicate and listen effectively
- Promote well-being and positive mental health
- Signpost to further help and support

#### **Additional features**

- **School Lead Handbook** This handbook covers all key elements of a peer mentoring programme from setting up the programme to the monitoring and evaluation
- Peer Mentors Training Programme This training will provide staff with a framework of activities to use with their peer mentors to make sure they are fully prepared for the role
- Peer Mentors Poster- This poster will help schools promote their programme
- **Peer Mentors Handbook** Pupils will be supported to record and reflect on their learning from taking part in the peer mentoring training
