#### Easter Bingo Review

For the next bingo event we need to consider:

- Adding tables into the dining area
- Improved process to book tables for large groups but still have tables available for walk-ins.
  More advertising and booking for groups that will use whole table. People to contact via
  email if they are booking a table for 2 smaller groups and provide lead names of the
  bookings to ensure multiple tables are not booked for the same group.
- Table plan worked well to tell people where their tables were on arrival.
- Brief housekeeping message at the start to cover fire escapes and also vaping. We had an instance where visitors were vaping in the toilets.
- We will make a risk assessment available and share this with volunteers.
- Raffle to be drawn at the raffle table to ensure it runs smoothly. Ticket drawn is put straight on the relevant prize.

#### Summer Quiz Night

Quiz night in July. For prizes, RB suggested a monetary prize which is in line with normal quiz prizes and may encourage more people to attend, but also because hamper prizes like we do for other winter-based events would be rather difficult to put together in the summer months. We still have £119 left from the non-uniform money we raised at the start of the year with the purpose of buying prizes so this could go towards prizes.

3<sup>rd</sup> - £50 or £25

Total £175 or £150 so we would only need to take £56 or £31 out of the actual profit of the event.

After asking the opinion of others, they said if we could go for the higher prize it would be better.

We agreed that we would charge £15 per team and limit each team to 6 players.

Date to be agreed and we will see if MR is available to help with being Quizmaster.

#### **Purchase of Chromebooks**

RB spoke about a proposal for the purchase of laptops. It is proposed that we but slightly less than a class set which will enable us to get a better spec as the laptops must be suitable for the operating system upgrade. We propose that the laptops are used in LSU and SEND. These areas are supervised and as the laptops will be brought and not leased this will prolong their life.

After discussion we have agreed on buying 19 laptops on option 2.

ME raised that the school will also add in some money to enable the purchase of 25 laptops (6 additional)

# Friends of Alcester Academy Laptop Proposal

# April 2024

The friends of Alcester Academy have raised £5k to spend on student devices. Initially it was hoped that this would facilitate a full class set (30) of devices but this is not realistic with the budget we have and if we want the devices to be 'future proof', in particular be compatible with Windows 11 that we will be forced to upgrade to by autumn 2025. Therefore it is proposed that a reduced number of better quality and specification devices be purchased and used in key areas such as the LSU, SEND and isolation rooms. I have audited the devices in these areas and they are particularly old and in a state of disrepair and so are in need of replacement.

Having bought (as opposed to leased) devices in these areas is a risk as if they are not looked after we will have to fund repairs ourselves, however these areas are always staffed and pupils are never left without direct supervision so the risk should be minimal.

Three options for devices are outlined below. My recommendation would be Option 2 as it is a similar spec to option 1 just with a slightly smaller screen, therefore is slightly cheaper and would allow us to purchase more of them for the budget we have.
