### Course content

With the new BTEC Tech Award in Music Practice, you will learn about the various music products, develop valuable skills and techniques in music creation, performance and production, and explore potential careers in the industry.

This course is a practical introduction to life and work in the music industry and is comprised of 3 components.

Component 2 Music Skills Development (30%)

Component 3
Responding to a Commercial Music Brief (40%)



# Component 1

### **Exploring Music Products and Styles**

Aim: explore musical styles and techniques, and gain an understanding of roles in the industry

- Explore different styles and genres of music
- Take part in practical workshops to understand stylistic features and characteristics
- Learn about the different products the music industry
- Develop techniques in realising musical products



# Component 2

### Music Skills Development

Aim: develop musical knowledge, skills, and techniques and apply them to a music product

- Reflect on your progress, and on areas for improvement
- Choose a job role and explore the skills needed to fulfil it
- Develop a range of skills
- Apply skills and techniques in a music <u>performance</u>, <u>creation</u> or <u>production</u> (focusing on 2 of the 3 pathways)



# Component 3

Responding to a Commercial Music Brief

Aim: put skills into practice by responding to a brief as a composer, performer or producer

- Explore the brief and produce possible responses and ideas
- Use relevant resources, skills and techniques to develop and refine musical material
- Present your final response
- Review and reflect your approach to the brief and your final outcome
