Pastoral Support at Alcester Academy

Our pastoral support at Alcester Academy will mainly come through your tutor who you will see every morning as part of your tutor group, where you will be with a group of year 7 students. They will get to know you well and you will get to know them. Tutor groups usually have about 25 students in and you will remain in that group for years 7 to 10.

The LSU is an area where any problem can be solved—it may be something lost, or you may have forgotten something, you may not be feeling well, you may have fallen out with your friends or had an argument, you may be worried about something at home or school.

The LSU is here to help and solve any issues you might have. Our main job is to make sure that you feel happy and well supported at school. We are there when things are going well, and if things go a bit wrong, we can help you get back on track. LSU is open before school, during school, including breaks and lunchtimes, and after school.

Our LSU is staffed all the time. The staff based in the LSU are: Miss Buckthorp (Assistant Headteacher—Student Wellbeing & Pastoral) and her team Mrs Clarke, Mrs Bennett and Miss Bartlett. Along with Mrs Hatcher, who is our attendance officer.

All the staff based in LSU are also part of the designated safeguarding team at the Academy. Miss Buckthorp is the Designated Safeguarding Lead for the school. We are really looking forward to meeting you all soon and are excited about you becoming part of our fabulous school.

SEND Support at Alcester Academy

We understand that starting a new school can be very daunting for both students and their parents, but more so if you have special education needs or disabilities. So, to help provide a smooth transition from primary to secondary school, the SEND Department at Alcester Academy provide a range of resources and additional transition opportunities.

Our dedicated SEND team includes SENCo Mrs Bush, Teaching Assistants (TAs) Mrs Anderson, Mrs Finlinson, Miss Butler, Miss Ballinger, Miss Coombes, Mrs Goldsby, Miss Howard, Mrs Lewis, Mrs Ross and SEND admin assistant Mrs Lacey.

TAs support lessons in all year groups and all subject areas, whilst also carrying out one to one mentoring for specific students, as well as individual and group interventions. Within the maths, English and DT departments there are

also subject specific Teaching Assistants. Additional key people who work with us include specialists from SEND Supported; particularly Lucy Clarke, Autism specialist teacher and Claire Cole, Lead Consultant - Cognition and Learning/ Dyslexia.

The SEND department run a number of clubs outside of lesson time including friendship group for fun lunchtime activities, homework clubs at lunch time and twice a week after school and handwriting club.

To help with transition we can provide children with visual timetables, maps, checklists and we have a video tour of the school on the website. We hope to get to know and understand your children and their needs better through meetings with primary school SENCo's and parents prior to the end of the summer term.

Students—Don't panic!

These are some worries you may have:

I haven't done my homework or left it at home

Tell your teacher in the lesson if you have got the subject that day or find your teacher at break or lunchtime. There is also chances to complete it at break and lunch in the LRC or homework club.

I don't understand the homework or classwork

Go and speak to your teacher as soon as possible. Don't be embarrassed to do this as you are probably not the only one! You could also check with someone in your teaching group or check the instruction on Google Classroom.

I'm lost in the Academy

Remember you have a map in this booklet. There will be lots of staff and students to help you during your first few weeks. You can also go to LSU and they will help you.

I'm late for school

Come into school as soon as possible and staff will guide you. If you are late, after 8.50am, please sign in with the Attendance Officer who will be standing by the door.

I've got a doctors or dentist appointment in school time

Ask your parents to write a letter to your tutor. When you leave the academy to go to your appointment you must sign out with the Attendance Officer and sign back in again when you come back.

I need to speak to a teacher

Go to their teaching room or speak to your tutor first thing in the morning about how to find them.

I need to phone home

Go to LSU and ask them if you can phone home.

(e.g. to say that a football/netball practice has been cancelled.)

I've left my Student Planner at home

Write your homework down on a piece of paper, when you get home write it in your Student Planner as soon as possible.

I've been absent and missed work

Ask your teacher what you have missed. Remember a friend in your teaching group may be able to help you catch up too and there may be work on Google Classroom for you to work through.

I feel ill in a lesson

Tell your teacher and they may send you to the LSU.

I feel ill or hurt myself at break/lunchtime

Go to LSU where you will be seen by a first aider, if necessary.

I've missed my bus home


Go to LSU and they will phone your parents. Wait there for your parents to collect you - DO NOT wait outside.
